 Angel Gabriel announced to Mary in Nazareth that she would have a son named Jesus. 	Luke 1:26–31
• After the angel's visit, Mary went to visit Elizabeth and stayed for three months.	Luke 1:39–40 Luke 1:56
• Elizabeth (mother of John the Baptist) was related to Mary.	Luke 1:36
• Mary traveled with Joseph from Nazareth to Bethlehem to register for the census.	Luke 2:5
• In Bethlehem, Mary gave birth to Jesus.	Luke 2:6–7
 Shepherds came to visit Jesus, Mary and Joseph. 	Luke 2:16
• Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord and offer a sacrifice.	Luke 2:22
• At the temple, they met Simeon, who had been waiting to see the Messiah.	Luke 2:25–32
Simeon prophesied concerning Mary and Jesus.	Luke 2:33–35
 Still at the temple, Mary and Joseph met a prophetess named Anna who spoke about Jesus. 	Luke 2:36–38
• Mary, Joseph and Jesus returned to Nazareth.	Luke 2:39
 After the visit of the Wise Men, Mary, Joseph and Jesus fled to Egypt to escape King Herod. 	Matthew 2:13
• Mary, Joseph and Jesus returned from Egypt to Nazareth.	Matthew 2:19–23
• Every year, Mary, Joseph and Jesus returned to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover.	Luke 2:41
• When Jesus was 12, Mary, Joseph and Jesus were returning home from the Passover. Jesus was lost. He was found in the temple talking with the rabbis.	Luke 2:42–52
• Mary was with Jesus at a wedding in Cana.	John 2:1
• Mary was present at Jesus' crucifixion.	John 19:26
• Mary was in the Upper Room with the disciples on the day of Pentecost.	Acts 1:13–14

What Did Mary Know?

- She knew that her son would not be an ordinary child.
- Her pregnancy announced by an angel, and that his name would be Jesus.
- The angel told her, "...He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and...his kingdom will never end."

Luke 1:32-33 (NIV)
