Review of the world's major religions

- Buddhism believes God is irrelevant. If there is a God, God is not involved in the world or in our lives.
- **Hinduism** believes God (Brahman) is an impersonal, unknowable force who is distant, removed, and detached from our lives.
- Islam believes God is the Almighty who gave the Quran and demands strict adherence.
- **Judaism** believes that God is the giver of the Law and seeks justice, righteousness and obedience.
- Christianity focuses on God's love.

Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love.

What was God's remedy to deal with our sin problem once and for all?

God Himself put on flesh to become one of us!

**Our Hindu friends believe** that salvation is found in learning how to become perfect through a cycle of reincarnations until that day when through their own effort they can be reunited with God as a drop of water in a vast ocean.

**Our Buddhist friends believe** that salvation is found through meditation and detaching themselves from people, thoughts and desires over a cycle of thousands of lifetimes until finally their soul dissipates like vapor in the wind.

**Our Muslim friends believe** that salvation is found in fully yielding oneself to God through prayer, fasting, alms giving, a pilgrimage to Mecca, and strict adherence and obedience to the Quran. By doing these things they hope that Allah will accept them.

**Our Reform Judaism friends** do not believe in heaven or hell. They attempt to please God by living out Jewish values of justice, fairness and doing good deeds.

**Christians believe** salvation is not about what you do or don't do. Salvation is all about what God did for us in lesus on the cross. Our response is to live out the gospel life in grateful appreciation.

Jesus Christ, I would like to be one of your followers.

I accept the gift of salvation you offer. I put my trust in you.

Help me to know you, honor you, and live for you. Forgive my sins. Wash me clean and make me new.
