

## Philippians 2:19-30 (NIV)

I hope in the Lord Jesus to send <u>Timothy</u> to you soon, <u>THAT I ALSO MAY BE CHEERED</u> when I receive news about you. <sup>20</sup> I have no one else like him, who will <u>show genuine concern</u> for your welfare. <sup>21</sup> For everyone looks out for their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. <sup>22</sup> But you know that Timothy has <u>proved himself</u>, because as a son with his father he has served with me in the work of the gospel. <sup>23</sup> I hope, therefore, to send him as soon as I see how things go with me. <sup>24</sup> And I am confident in the Lord that I myself will come soon. <sup>25</sup> But I think it is necessary to send back to you <u>Epaphroditus</u>, <u>my brother</u>, <u>co-worker and fellow soldier</u>, who is also your messenger, whom you sent to take care of my needs. <sup>26</sup> For he <u>longs for all of you and is distressed</u> because you heard he was ill. <sup>27</sup> Indeed <u>he was ill</u>, and almost died. But God had mercy on him, and not on him only but also on me, to spare me sorrow upon sorrow. <sup>28</sup> Therefore I am all the more eager to send him, so that when you see him again <u>YOU MAY BE GLAD</u> and <u>I MAY HAVE LESS ANXIETY</u>. <sup>29</sup> So then, <u>welcome him</u> in the Lord <u>with great joy</u>, and <u>honor people like him</u>, <sup>30</sup> because he almost died for the work of Christ. <u>He risked his life</u> to make up for the help you yourselves could not give me.

## Summary of the Text

Paul is sending two supporters back to the Philippian Church

**Timothy**: I have no one else like him ... (v. 20)

**Epaphroditus**: Welcome him ...HONOR people like him (v. 29)

• I'm sending (these men)...

So that I may be CHEERED (v. 19) So that you may be GLAD (v. 28) So that I may have less ANXIETY (v. 28b)
