Holy Ambition is living out God's dream for your life in full trust and obedience.

The eyes of the Lord search the whole earth in order to <u>strengthen</u> those <u>whose hearts are fully</u> <u>committed to him.</u> 2 Chronicles 16:9 (NLT)

Note: Living your life for the Lord and championing God's agenda does not mean that your life will be smooth sailing.

## Timeless Truism:

Our greatest personal victories are almost always followed by periods of intense opposition.

We must anticipate opposition.

Everyone who enters an athletic contest goes into strict training. They do it to win a temporary crown, but we do it to win one that will be permanent. <sup>26</sup> ... So I box—but not as if I were just shadow boxing. I Corinthians 9:25-26 (GW)

Sanballat was very angry when he learned that we were rebuilding the wall. He flew into a rage and mocked the Jews, <sup>2</sup> saying in front of his friends and the Samarian army officers, "What does this bunch of poor, feeble Jews think they're doing? Do they think they can build the wall in a single day by just offering a few sacrifices? Do they actually think they can make something of stones from a rubbish heap—and charred ones at that?"

Nehemiah 4:1-2 (NLT)

Tobiah the Ammonite, who was standing beside him, remarked, "That stone wall would collapse if even a fox walked along the top of it."

Nehemiah 4:3 (NLT)

Voices dripping with sarcasm, ridicule and criticism land the first punch when you are living with Holy Ambition.

But when Sanballat and Tobiah and the Arabs, Ammonites, and Ashdodites heard that the work was going ahead and that the gaps in the wall of Jerusalem were being repaired, they were <u>furious</u> . <sup>8</sup> They all made plans to <u>come and fight</u> against Jerusalem and throw us into confusion.
