### I. The Origin of "God said it. I believe it, and that settles it."

- The actual source of the phrase is unknown.
- Those who popularized the phrase was a 1970's Christian Gospel singing group called The Heritage Singers.

Many Christians when they say, "God said it. I believe it, and that settles it," imply "if the Bible says something, we ought to believe it and do it. Period."

#### 2. Here is the problem with that: It \_\_\_\_\_\_\_.

You must have a designated area outside the camp where you can go to relieve yourself. Each of you must have a spade as part of your equipment. Whenever you relieve yourself, dig a hole with the spade and cover the excrement. The camp must be holy, for the Lord your God moves around in your camp to protect you and to defeat your enemies. He must not see any shameful thing among you, or he will turn away from you.

Deuteronomy 23:12–14 (NLT)

When indoor plumbing became possible in churches in the late 1800s and early 1900s, numerous pastors preached sermons against indoor toilets in the church believing that doing so violated the command of God in Deuteronomy 23.

Taking "God said it. I believe it, and that settles it" at face-value means that we will all need to change our lifestyle. For example:

- Leviticus 19:19 Do not wear clothing woven of two kinds of material.
- Leviticus 11:7–12 Eliminate pork and shrimp from your diet.
- Leviticus 19:27 (Men) Don't trim the edges of your beard.
- Leviticus 19:28 Do not mark your skin with tattoos.
- Exodus 35:2 Children who curse or strike their parents or who are persistently rebellious should be put todeath.

• Deut. 22:21 (Women) If you are not a virgin when you marry, the men of your town are to stone you to death.

Some say that those commands represent God's covenant with Israel and are no longer binding on Christians. Here's what Jesus said:

"Don't misunderstand why I have come. I did not come to abolish the law of Moses or the writings of the prophets. No, I came to accomplish their purpose. <sup>18</sup>I tell you the truth, until heaven and earth disappear, not even the smallest detail of God's law will disappear until its purpose is achieved. <sup>19</sup> So if you ignore the least commandment and teach others to do the same, you will be called the least in the Kingdom of Heaven."

Matthew 5:17–19 (NLT)

Not even Jesus interpreted God's law with the understanding of "God said it. I believe it, and that settles it."

- Jesus' disciples picked grains of wheat on the Sabbath. Pharisees saw them and called Jesus out on their unlawful behavior. Jesus said, The Sabbath was made for man, and not man for the Sabbath.
   Mark 2:27 (NIV)
- Jesus said that if a man divorces his wife except for sexual unfaithfulness and marries another woman, he
  commits adultery. But how did Jesus respond to the woman? Mercy, compassion and not judgment.
