# The Resurrection Story

Saturday evening, when the Sabbath ended, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome went out and purchased burial spices so they could anoint Jesus' body. Very early on Sunday morning, just at sunrise, they went to the tomb. On the way they were asking each other, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" But as they arrived, they looked up and saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled aside.

When they entered the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a white robe sitting on the right side. The women were shocked, but the angel said, "Don't be alarmed. You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He isn't here! He is risen from the dead! Look, this is where they laid his body."

### The Events of the First Easter

# FRIDAY AFTERNOON—3 P.M.—GOLGOTHA

What we know:

- Jewish Sabbath begins at sundown (6 p.m.).
- Burials were forbidden by Jewish law on the Sabbath.
- Jesus died at 3 p.m., and the two thieves crucified with Jesus died around 4 p.m., leaving just two hours to remove the bodies from the crosses before sundown.

- John was the only disciple present at the crucifixion, and there is no record of any of Jesus' 11 remaining disciples present at his burial.
- Joseph of Arimathea petitioned Pontius Pilate (Roman Governor) for permission to claim Jesus' body and bury him in his own family tomb.

#### SATURDAY—THE SECOND DAY

## What we know:

- Pontius Pilate ordered Roman soldiers to be stationed at the tomb in order to prevent anyone from stealing Jesus' body.
- The disciples were hiding behind locked doors in an upper room somewhere in Jerusalem.

#### SUNDAY MORNING—SUNRISE—THE THIRD DAY

#### What we know:

- Mary Magdalene and two other women went to the tomb to complete the burial ritual.
- The stone sealing the tomb was rolled away.
- The tomb was empty.
- An angel appeared telling the women, "He isn't here. He has risen from the dead."

## **AN UNBELIEVABLE STORY**

- MARK 16:1-8—The women learned that Jesus had been raised, but they were so afraid they didn't tell anyone.
- MATTHEW 28:16-17—After the disciples saw Jesus alive, "some of them doubted."
- **LUKE 24:8–1 I**—Mary and the other women rushed back to tell the disciples what they had seen, "but the story sounded like nonsense to the men, so they didn't believe it."
- **JOHN 20:24–29**—Thomas: "I won't believe it unless I see the nail wounds in his hands, put my fingers into them, and place my hand into the wound in his side."
