Fieldtrips and Enrichment Programs

<u>Music</u>

Children will attend music and movement classes once a week. Classes will be taught by our Music and Movement specialist. The Music and Movement curriculum will be developed using a variety of seasonal, secular, Christian and theme related music and musical experiences.

<u>Science</u>

Children will participate in Greentree's Science Enrichment program once a week. Enrichment is a small group setting. The science curriculum presented in Enrichment will be an extension of and in addition to the science curriculum taught by the classroom teachers.

Physical Education

The children will participate in a weekly P.E. class with tumbling and gross motor activity elements. The children attend tumbling in groups of eight while the remaining eight students have a small group activity with the classroom teaching team. SOLs are followed for P.E.

<u>Art</u>

Art is offered once a week. The children participate in a fun, engaging, hands-on art class with instruction and application in accordance with the SOLs for art. This art component is in addition to the art incorporated in the classroom themes and lessons. The children attend art in small groups.

Bible Class

Children will engage in weekly Bible classes, in small group settings. There will be "take home" applications that can be done at home, to further illustrate and articulate what was learned in class. Children will be encouraged to engage in practical application of the Fruits of the Spirit, in the classroom and at home.

Library

Children will participate in weekly library. They will hear a story, participate in a hands-on reading activities or story extensions. Students will be allowed to check out books from the school library collection.

Fieldtrips and Enrichment Programs

Monthly Fieldtrips

In Kindergarten, the students participate in many fieldtrips during the school year. Fieldtrips give the children hands-on experiences that coordinate with units of study and serve to further enhance the students' understanding of key concepts. Costs for the fieldtrips are funded by the activity fee, paid with your first tuition payment.

The instructional and administrative team will work together with the interests of the children to choose field trip destinations and activities that continue to engage the children in active learning and understanding of concepts found in the Virginia Standards of Learning.
